

Your Degree Pathway

A degree in Culture & Expression requires the completion of 90 Credits for a Bachelor's Degree (three years) or 120 Credits for an Honours Degree (four years). Your courses will consist of Major, General Education, and Elective Courses.

First Year

First year will introduce you to the university environment, provide you with general education courses, and allow options for you to study courses aligned with your own interests.



Culture & Expression Courses: Questioning Culture

General Education Courses: Humanities, Social Sciences or Natural Sciences (for non-science students)

Elective Courses: Your choice of courses outside of Culture & Expression

Second Year

In your second year, you will continue your development of the fundamentals in Culture & Expression.

General Education Courses: Humanities, Social Sciences or Natural Sciences (for non-science students)

Elective Courses: Choose new subjects to explore or continue to develop skills from previous selections

Third Year

Your third year in Culture & Expression will allow you to explore specific interests in the field.



Culture & Expression Course Options: Digital Culture in the Humanities, Black Popular Culture, Experiencing Canadian Culture, Popular Expression in North American Music, Feminisms and Film + more

Elective Courses: Choose new subjects to explore or continue to develop skills from previous selections

Fourth Year

In your fourth and final year, your courses in Culture & Expression will be designed to meet your specific interests.



Culture & Expression Course Options: Social Movements and the Expressive Arts, Fetish Appeal: Desire and Consumption, Architecture and Social Change, Propaganda and Culture, Modernism Across the Arts + more

Elective Courses: These courses can include additional Culture & Expression courses or further courses of interest at the upper level
